They have 25ha under vine all of which is certified Grade A organic/biodynamic. Their Vine Vale vineyard has extensive plantings of very old vines as well as fruit trees and vegetable production.

In the morning, Wayne and Suzi will show how biodynamics is enhancing the quality and productivity of their historic vineyard. Topics to be discussed will include:

- maximising soil fertility;
- composting –scale and methods;
- weed and pest management;
- biodynamic stirring and spraying setup; and
- biodynamic preparation making and use.
