


MARCH 2024

The biodynamic system has a powerful vitalising effect on soil and plants, and thus benefits food producing systems and other land use environments where it is applied.

Such losses lead to lower food quality, less water holding capacity of soil, decreased plant species biodiversity, increased plant susceptibility to extremes of weather and climate, and greater risk of soil


The Essence of Biodynamic Agriculture

The biodynamic preparations are powerful stimulators of biological activity in the soil, and when combined with associated biological agricultural practices, enable farmers and gardeners to produce food of the highest quality with minimal inputs.

The REGENERATE health Summit is coming to Melbourne!


Six pioneering speakers. An iconic Melbourne venue. One inspiring day. Time to learn, connect and thrive!

Brian Keats Antipodean Astro Calendar

As the months start getting cooler March brings on lots of jobs to do in the garden and farm. Our Brian Keats Calendar is a fabulous resource showing you what to plant when. The above is a page from the calendar, clearly marked for your understanding.

Useful Moon dates/times for spraying – Autumn 2024

[Eastern Australian Standard Time – adjust for your local time zone where necessary.]

Moon opposition Saturn - March 23rd, 7.17pm

[Note that this strongly vitalising influence is "in orb" for up to 12 hours either side of the opposition time. It is believed that spraying out biodynamic soil preparations (late afternoon) and atmospheric preparations (early morning) back-to-back reinforces the balance between the Moon's calcium influence and Saturn's silica influence, giving pasture and crops greater resilience to weather extremes, diseases and pests.]

Moon descending periods - March 6th - 17th.

This is the best time to apply our Soil Activator and Liquid Soil Activator. [This is the recommended/usual soil spraying time, when the Moon's influence is working below the soil surface.] -

Moon ascending periods - March 18th - April 1st (Lunar Eclipse 25th March - don't spray)

Apply Horn Silica 501 during this time. [This is the recommended/usual time to spray out the atmospheric preparations when the Moon's influence is more

Rain making - Not suitable for March 2024.

[To encourage rain, consider buying a Rain Plus Kit. A series of four soil and atmospheric sprays are put out over three successive days when the Moon is in a water sign and preferably near Full Moon.]

Biodynamic Liquid Soil Activator (LSA)

A potent living biodynamic soil spray that brings a healthy balance to the soil.

Contains biodynamic preparations: (500–508)

No stirring required – just dilute and apply.

USES

Broadacre

- pastures and crops, as both a soil and foliar sorew
- via stock pour into water troughs at recommended dilution so that stock can spread over large and/or inaccessible areas

Gardens and Market Gardens

- as a soil spray prior to planting seedlings
- for vegetable gardens, flower beds and pot plants
- for green manure crops to aid breakdown when turned-in
- · as a seed bath or root dip before transplanting
- add to liquid fertilisers such as biodynamic fish or seaweed concentrate
- add to water used in compost making
- add to septic tanks and composting toilets to cancel odours and improve microbial breakdown
- add to watering can and sprinkled over worm farm or home composting container.

DILUTION [dilution ratio: 1:100]

1 litre LSA in 100 litres water is sufficient for 3ha 330ml LSA in 33 litres water is sufficient for 1ha 100ml LSA in 10 litres water is sufficient for 3000m² 30ml LSA in 3 litres water is sufficient for 1000m² (quarter acre)

METHOD

Shake LSA container, then add appropriate volume for the correct dilution, into sprayer/ spray tank water. Fish/seaweed products can be added at the same time and sprayed out together with LSA. Spray out in droplets for soil spray; mist for foliar spray. It is best to spray after about 3pm or after the heat of the day has subsided.

FREQUENCY

Spray out monthly but at least twice a year at active growing times, especially after rain or during drought.

STORAGE

Store in a cool dry dark place as far away as possible from electrical fields and appliances.
